The Oregon Convention Center (OCC) became the nation's first LEED-EB meeting facility in 2004, is now LEED Platinum, and earned Global Biorisk Advisory Council (GBAC) STAR accreditation in 2021. The OCC offers 255,000 square feet of contiguous exhibit space, 50 meeting rooms totaling 55,000 square feet and two ballrooms totaling 60,000 square feet.

4 Easy to Get Around

Portland's user-friendly MAX light rail makes it easy to get from Portland International Airport (PDX), voted the nation's best by Travel + Leisure readers, to downtown and the convention center. The compact central city is supremely walkable, with short, 200-foot blocks; miles of bike lanes and electric bike-share make it easy to roll like a local.
