9 PORTLAND SATURDAY MARKET - Operating since 1974, the Portland Saturday Market is the largest continually operating outdoor arts and crafts market in the nation. The Market offers a unique opportunity for customers to meet the artist as well as see one of a kind pieces created in the artist's booth. Over 250 small businesses and individual artists from across the NW region gather each week for the event (March through Christmas Eve).
